
Michelle is the author of three books. Her new book The Success-Energy Equation, debuted as a bestseller in October 2020.

What happened next is the riveting story Alvin has shared with over 2,000,000 people on five continents in over 7,500 events from the youngest to the oldest people alive. He also has extremely rare credentials.

A Certified Speaking Professional, a designation owned by less than seven percent of professional speakers worldwide. He is a best selling author of Alvin's Laws Of Life...5 Steps to Successfully Overcome Anything! He is actually in not one, but Two Halls of Fame. The Canadian Professional Speakers and the Canadian Disability Foundation each inducted him for his remarkable achievements and the epitome of resiliency and determination.

He has an actual Emmy award for a short feature film on ABC-TV in America. He played a credited role on the hit TV show, X-Files, and a film by renowned director Harmony Korine called Julien...Donkey Boy (Yes, it was weird). He's also appeared on over 100 telethons and since 1976, had been directly involved in raising over \$225,000,000 for charity.

Born in 1966 on "The Blood Reserve" – an Indian reservation in Southern Alberta, Canada.

He grew up in the Blackfoot tribe with his grandparents. They were of the older generation and lived in the traditional way, where also the oral tradition of knowledge and mythologies was an important part – that is why Pablo possess a very great historical and practical knowledge concerning the Prairie Indians' original way of life, and like his grandparents he is an excellent storyteller.

Elder Doreen Healy was born and raised on the Blood Reserve, Blackfoot Confederacy, Southern Alberta. Doreen is a member of the Kainai Nation, Blood Tribe. She is a residential school survivor, taken from her family at age 5.

Doreen's career has provided her the opportunity to see all perspectives from Government, private industry and Indigenous communities. She has worked with Federal and Provincial governments; worked as a consultant for Treaty #7 First Nations, founding the Native Economic Developers Association (NEDA) that executed major projects in Tourism, Uof Waterloo Ec Dev Graduate program, and today, NEDA is the Treaty 7 Tribal Council; she worked in the oil and gas industry for a number of years with Amoco Canada and MEG Energy as an Indigenous Relations Liaison.

Currently, still working with the Alberta Energy Regulator (AER) as an Indigenous Engagement Specialist, Doreen's role is to provide advice and guidance for AER staff in working with Indigenous communities on projects and relationship building. She also provides advice and guidance as the Resident Elder for AER.
